	expanding the contextualization of the research; detail elements of the methodology such as
	scientific pluralism and interdisciplinarity; rewrite the beginning of the literature review;
	rewrite the conclusion in its entirety. Furthermore, the article is not fully compliant with
	standards, with spacing problems, page indentation, lack of italics in et al and references with
	no formatting. Still regarding writing, the fact that the article constantly presents a list or
	topics leaves the reading truncated and without articulation with the rest of the paragraph.
	Finally, the authors need to fill out the Credit Author statement. Therefore, major
	modifications to this article are recommended.
