The article fits the scope of the journal, presenting a relevant and current topic as well as a good development of the argument proposed by the authors.

MANDATORY CHANGES (are marked in **red, underlined and bold** in the text with comments submitted):

- - The abstract needs to be reduced to the limit of 150 words.
- There are several laws cited in the text that are not referenced, all laws and government documents need to be referenced.
- The methodology is well explained but lacks theoretical foundations. It would be relevant to find theoretical foundations both for the proposed analysis methods and for how to use these methods.

OTHER CHANGES (non-mandatory)

General: The topic presented and developed in the work is a very current and relevant one, although the terms used by the authors are not so common in Brazil. Even so, the concept of academic integrity and the fight against plagiarism and other bad practices is something that is being debated all over the world and much of it still has no definitive answer, especially in the area of humanities, and the authors even mention the expansion of the work with the topic of AI, which is also of great relevance, but it would be an interesting addition to mention the academic articles themselves within this debate, either just as an addendum to the discussion or as another possibility for expansion in future work in the conclusion. After all, the academic article, like the one written by the authors, has become one of, if not the main form of academic communication and in much of the world it is at the center of debates about plagiarism and other bad academic practices that need to be addressed and changed.
